



"O House of Jacob, come,

Let us walk in the Light of the LORD." (Isaiah 2.5)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Carmel,

Man proposes and God disposes.... By now I do not need any arguments to convince any of you of this reality. However, one thing is sure: God's steadfast and unconditional love will always stands there! It is no wonder that the Prophet is asking us to *walk in the light of the LORD*. The Psalmist has this to say about this light: "The unfolding of your words gives light; it imparts understanding even to the simple." (Psalm 119.130). John's Gospel tells us that "The true light which enlightens everyone was coming into the world." (John 1.9). As we venture our way through the Year of Faith, and also through Advent and the Christmas Festivities, it does help us to have a better idea of the notion of light, especially in the New Testament writings.

The word light enters in the whole New Testament about 73 times, and 3 times out of these 73, are to be found in the Johannine literature; especially John's Gospel. So a short and quick look into this phenomena will help us to have a better approach towards the Feast of Light (Christmas)...the Feast of our Salvation: *A GREAT LIGHT SHONE AROUND THEM*.

"Then the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, Do not be afraid; for see – I bring you good news of great joy for all the people..." Luke 2.9b-10

Light, brilliance, brightness, daylight, eyesight, and even sunlight, these are words that are engulfed in the Greek word for light: **Phos**. Strictly speaking, in the Greek language, the word **Phos** mainly refers to the natural light of day, that kind of light that figurative speaking has the power to generate life. It is no wonder than that the same Greek word is also applied to light when we speak about The Light of LIFE! Thus the expression: The Light that gives Life and vice versa: "What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." John 1.3c-5.

Though we stand in the  $21^{st}$  century, our darkness is not all that different from the darkness that surrounded the shepherds by night... and as such, we can also say that neither the light – God's Glory. This is the good news that is also being announced to all the people today: God's Glory is

shining around us, and as soon as we too open our ears, and our eyes, then Our hearts too will be opened...and we too feel in our hearts the same JOY TO THE WORLD that the shepherds experience, and that the Disciples of Emmaus experienced - Luke 24.31-32: "Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. They said to each other, 'were not our hearts burning with us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scripture to us?""

While we scrutinize the last quote (Luke 24.31-32) we notice the vocabulary that the Evangelist is using: eyes open ... talking to us... opening the scriptures... and burning hearts !!! ...and he vanished from their sight!!! One might ask here the important question: Where did he go? And the answer to this mysterious question is: In Their hearts ... and in your heart and mine! Indeed, it is in our heart that this serious encounter with Jesus has to take place... It is there where the prophet told us that God wants to speak to us: "Therefore, I will now allure her, and bring her into the wilderness' and speak tenderly to her heart." (Hosea 2.14). This word has the power to dispel any fear from within us and around us... to make the darkness disappear and change it into the reflection of God's Glory... HIS LIGHT and HIS JOY.... His word is light (Psalm 119.130) and it is also the cause of Joy... "These things I have said to you so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete." (John 15.11).

We are in the Year of Faith, and as such we are challenged to increase our familiarity with the Word of God which brings light to those that are in darkness... In reading and reflecting upon the articles in this issue of Carmel Lights (which being late is all my fault...so many things that wait on me)... we are in a privileged way because we are being instructed how to treasure this light and do with His grace what he instructed us to do: "Let your light shine in front of others, so that seeing your good deeds, they will give praise to your Father who is in Heaven." (Matthew 5.16).

As Christians, and even more so as members of a Religious Order, we are called to bear much fruit, and not to be religious nuts!!! "My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples." (John 15.8). It is by adhering to His word that we will become His disciples and thus light to and of the world – John 8.31b.
