


After Mass everyone went to the parish hall for a reception in the hall which was beautifully decorated with posters of past and recent events. Parishioner Peter

As Carmelites worldwide celebrated the V Centenary of the Birth of St. Teresa of Jesus, the Carmelites of Western Canada OCDS culminated the year long festivities on October 17, 2015 at St. Edmund's Parish, North Vancouver, BC with a lively celebration attended by close to 200 of the faithful who came to give honor to our Holy Mother, Master of Prayer and Doctor of the Church.

The day commenced with Mass officiated by former Provincial, Fr. Archibald Gonsalves and concelebrated by Fr. Rudolf D'Souza, Fr. Manoj Braganza, Fr. Jerald D'Souza, Fr. Mario Fernandes, Fr. 
received were extremely positive and complimentary with requests for a repeat performance. The play was written, produced and directed by Remi Vasquez OCDS.



St. Teresa of Avila's 500th birthday marks the start of new era for the community By Agnieszka Krawczynski The B.C. Catholic DEROCHE, B.C.

As Carmelites around the world celebrated the 500th anniversary of St. Teresa of Avila's birth, local members had even more reason to rejoice. Regional superior Father Rudolf D'Souza OCD, inaugurated a brand new Carmelite monastery Oct. 15.

"We've proved that with God, all things are possible," he told 700 people after Mass in a large tent next to Little Flower Monastery, named after another famous Carmelite, St. Therese of Lisieux.

The building sits on a hill in Deroche, a district east of Mission, B.C. Its seminarians, who will move in after construction is completely finished, will study theology and philosophy at the Seminary of Christ the King in Mission and be formed as Discalced Carmelites in Deroche.

"This really is a wonderful and blessed occasion, to mark the 500th anniversary of the birth of St. Teresa with the establishment of a monastery," said Archbishop J. Michael Miller, CSB, who blessed its unfinished walls. "This is to be a house of formation, and it is in fact a third house of formation founded in the archdiocese this year."

He has inaugurated two other formation houses so far in 2015: Redemptoris Mater, in Blessed Sacrament Parish in Vancouver, and one for the Congregation of St. John the Baptist, near the seminary in Mission.

Father Charles Serrao, OCD, the provincial superior of the Karnataka-Goa Carmelite province in India, said it all started when the Discalced Carmelites landed in the Archdiocese of Vancouver in 2003. One of them was Father Jerald D'Souza, who celebrated the 25th anniversary of his profession that day, and is pastor of St. Edmund's Parish. It and Guardian Angels Parish became major hubs for Carmelite activity.

"Our presence in Canada received another boost with the arrival of Father Rudolf D'Souza in 2009, after his long stint in India at St. Joseph's Parish in Mumbai," Father Serrao continued.

"Today the Little Flower formation house is a fruit mainly of his unwavering faith in divine providence," and his "unwavering zeal."

Four busloads of parishioners from Guardian Angels arrived to witness the blessing, along with three buses from St. Edmund's Parish, one bus of lay Carmelites from the Richmond area, and many other individuals.

Helen Chua Tiampo, 89, a quiet, modest Guardian Angels parishioner, received many accolades. In honour of her parents, she donated the funds required to buy the land and pay for construction. "We are greatly indebted to her for financing the property and construction in memory of her parents Jaime and Josefina Chua Tiampo," said Father Serrao. "With our meagre resources, we never would have been able to embark on a project of such magnitude in Canada."

A commemorative book released that day includes photos of Tiampo visiting the site and sitting on construction equipment.

Father Archibald Gonsalves, OCD, a former provincial superior, said there are currently 17 Carmelite foundations in Canada. "I wish that our Carmelite presence here will be able to rejuvenate, activate, in friendship and relationship, all people. Carmel will flourish in the days to come."

Bishops Frederick Henry of Calgary and David Monroe of Kamloops also participated in the grand opening. There already is a Carmelite community in Calgary, and the priests joked that Bishop Monroe's presence might indicate his diocese is next.

In another gesture to honour the 500th anniversary of St. Teresa of Avila's birth, Father Rudolf released a new book, a commentary about her spirituality, titled The Way Less Travelled.

"On several occasions, when she was writing her mystical experiences, she said: it is so difficult to express what I experienced," the priest explained. "That is my situation today. I don't have adequate words to express my deep gratitude."

They hope to complete Little Flower Monastery by the end of this year.


CARMEL GATT OCDS February 17, 2016




