

Discover Christ

As I wish all of you a happy and grace-filled Christmas, I want you to capture the joy in this crowded Season. At this time of the year, doesn't that sound like an impossible dream? Look around us, we are already crowded. Holiday magazines calling us to cook special holiday foods, decorate our tables and our homes; Christmas programs which promise to be the "best one" ever and not to be missed; stores bursting with sales, gifts; Christmas cards and the list goes on. Are you overwhelmed yet? And I haven't even talked about other things that crowd our season. Things like: tension, painful relationships, discord in your family, separation between family members, fear, loss of a job, loss of income, health issues overwhelming you, yours or someone close to you and memories of Christmases past either good or bad. This is a crowded season for all of us. Am I right? Let me ask you a question. I want you to think about the answer. Who or what might potentially "crowd" your Christmas this year? Save that answer, we're going to come back to it. We all are going to have a crowded season. But I believe we also all have an opportunity to capture joy, incredibly wonderful joy, "the good news of great joy".

Luke 2:1-7: Jesus was born into a crowded world. There were so many people that Caesar Augustus wanted to count them. Imagine the traffic on the roads with everyone trying to get "home' for the census. Picture the lines that you would have had to stand in to fill out the forms. When I see pictures of people sleeping in the airports during the holidays, the immense number of travelers, I think of the world that Christ was born in. A world crowded with people.

One night I was tucking my little niece into bed. We had read a story, said our prayers and were about to turn off the light when her mother came in and sat on the end of the bed to say goodnight. Then her brother came in and did the same, followed by her dad and granddad. Her little room and bed got very crowded and she was sleepy. Into the noise of everyone talking she said "There are too many people in my room"! We couldn't help but laugh and left.

When I read the story of Mary and Joseph I'm sure they felt like my niece. There were too many people in Bethlehem too, too many for Mary and Joseph to find a hotel. The inn had too many people; it was too crowded to give them a room. And yet, into this crowded space and time, Jesus comes and is born. His birth brings "great joy for all people." Dear friends, our joy does not come from the absence of a crowded season, but our joy comes in the midst of it. You and I will not be insulated from this crowded, frantic Christmas season. We will live in the middle of it. So the question arises "How do we, surrounded by the season, capture the joy that Christ came to bring?" The Scriptures tell us about the 3 groups of people that show us 3 different ways to capture Christmas Joy.

1. Discover Christ

When Jesus was eight days old, he was taken to the temple to be consecrated to the Lord fulfilling what was required by the Law of Moses. Many Jews at this time were looking for the Messiah to come. Some believed a great ruler would descend on the earth and overthrow all their enemies. But in contrast to them, there were also a few people who were known as "The Quiet in the Land". These Jews had a different view of Messiah. They didn't dream of armies but instead lived a life of quiet prayer and faithful watchfulness until God would reveal His Messiah. This very day that Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple, there was a devout elderly man named Simeon who had been told by the Spirit of God that he would not die until he saw the Messiah. Along with Simeon was an elderly widow named Anna. Listen to what happens. (Read: Luke 2:27-32, 36-38)

They discovered what they had been looking for all their lives. When they saw Him they knew this was the Christ, the Anointed One, and the Messiah. Discovering and receiving Christ for yourself is believing that He is who He said He was. This implies that we are saying to God, "I am a sinner. I am not perfect, no matter how good I try to be. I need a Savior. I trust Christ to be my Savior and Lord." That is the Good News, the true Christmas Story.

In the Gospel of Luke we learn how essential it is to see ourselves first as receivers. That's tough; we'd rather see ourselves as capable, self-sufficient, generous, caring givers. But the Gospel, the Good News, is for poor, needy, empty people who open their hands to the free gift of salvation in Jesus Christ. The question is Have you ever done that? Have you ever trusted Christ? Discovered Him? Joy in this crowded Christmas season, first comes with discovering Christ, personally knowing the One whose birth we celebrate.

As Carmelites, many of you have Discovered Him. Many of you have come to know Him, many of you have received Him as your Savior. But I think our challenge in this crowded season is to remember that no matter how long you have been a Christ follower, Jesus calls us to be "poor in spirit," meaning to be continually dependent on Him; to release the daily control of our lives to Him. The call for those of us who have received Him is to come to Know Him more. (Christmas = Christ-Mas = More Christ) The reason we want to know Him more is to become like Him, to expand our faith, to grow up in Christ. This is the life of the passionate disciple.

2. Treasure Christ

I do believe you can know Him and still fail to capture Joy in our crowded season. That brings us to another story. Along with discovering Christ, there is a call on our lives to treasure Christ. (Read: Matthew 2:1-11)

Soren Kierkegaard makes this interesting observation about the scribes in Jerusalem. They could explain where Messiah should be born but they stayed in Jerusalem. They did not accompany the Wise Men to seek Him. Similarly we may know the whole of Christianity, yet make no movement...what a difference! The three kings had only a rumor to go by but it moved them to make that long journey. The scribes were much better informed, much better versed. They sat and studied the Scriptures, but it did not make them move.

The scribes knew but they did not seek, they knew but they did not adore, they knew but they did not treasure. This could be true of us too. It was the Wise Men who pursued, continued to travel to find this new King. And when they found Him, they worshiped Him; they gave Him gifts; they adored Him; they treasured Him.

I like this word TREASURE especially during this season. Most of us receive gifts at Christmas, among those gifts only a few become treasures to us. I treasure an angel which my Mom gave me the first Christmas. I treasure a small Christmas tree my niece gave me about 10 years ago. I treasure the gold ring my dad gave me. I received many gifts, but few treasures. I'm sure that you have special gifts, large or small, which you treasure as well. However, God's gift of His Son to us is His Treasure to us, given so that we may Discover Him and Treasure Him. You may ask "how do we treasure Christ?" All of us can take the opportunity to offer our worship to Christ. But we also give to Christ our adoration in quiet private times of prayer and reflection. Those times restore our souls and allow us to take deep breaths of JOY in a Crowded Season.

3. Share Christ

Discovering Him and Treasuring Him leads us to Share Christ. (Read: Luke 2:8-20)

The shepherds were the first to hear the news. They hurried. They ran "to see" about "this thing" the angels spoke of. As soon as they saw, they went and shared with others. But if you know Him, and you treasure Him, you have a story to share with others. It's how your own life story has been changed by Christ's birth, His life, death and resurrection. There's an old saying "Share the Gospel every day in all you do, wherever you are. When necessary use words."

Do you remember the question I asked you earlier? "Who or what might 'crowd' your Christmas this year?" Whatever your answer, the Truth is all of us will have a crowded Christmas ahead. But what will you do to capture Joy in the midst? Jesus teaches "we reap what we sow" or I would say "what goes around, comes around". When you choose to Discover Christ, to Treasure Him and to Share His love with others, it doesn't matter how crowded your Christmas becomes, for you will capture the true Joy of the season.

Will you, surrounded by the crowded season, capture the joy that Christ came to bring?




NEW ADMINISTRATIVE TEAM IN TANZANIA!



FR. ALEXANDER BRAGANZA, one of four siblings, was born in Panjim, a town in Goa, India, He pursued his studies at the university level before entering the Seminary in Xellim in 1987.

After 12 years of formation, he was ordained into the Order of the Discalced Carmelite on April 21, 1998 following which he rnade his Bachelor of Arts, Sociology MA and Theology BTh. Following his ordination he served as Assistant Pastor at St. Joseph's Parish, Mumbai from 1998 to 2001; at the Retreat Centre, Dhyanashnam, Vasai from 2001 to 2005; as Assistant Pastor at St. Maria A Ripa, Empoli, Florence Italy from 2005 to 2010; at the Retreat

Centre, Dhyanashnam, Vasai from 2010 to 2014; and as Rector, Carmelite Seminary, Goa, India from 2014 to 2017. Fr. Alexander arrived to Canada on June 1, 2017 and has taken up his appointment as the Superior of Little Flower Monastery, Carmel Hill.

Responding to God's call in 1985, after the tenth grade Father Vincent joined the Discalced Carmelite Order. After four years of seminarian training he made his Simple Religious Profession in 1989. He graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Mysore University and Bachelor of Philosophy in Pushpashrama, Mysore Carmelite Seminary. He pursued his four years of theological studies at St. Joseph's Inter-Diocesan Seminary, Mangalore. He was ordained on April 23,

After his ordination he was appointed to Tapovana, Kushalnagar. In the year 1999, he was transferred to Holy Family Parish in Londa, Belgaum as Associate Pastor. Meanwhile, he studied through correspondence with Dharwad University and completed his Master of Arts in Sociology. On September 4th 2001 he was further appointed to Bahrain in the Middle East where he remained for nine long years as an Assistant Pastor. In October 2010, he returned to India and was given conventuality in the Community of Carmel Ashram, Katkere. He was then appointed as the first Parish Priest of St. Anthony's Church, Koteshwar, Udupi Diocese for about seven years. On July 13th 2017 he arrived at St. Edmund's Church, North Vancouver where the parishioners are delighted to have him as their Assistant Pastor.



THE KARNATAKA-GOA PROVINCE REMEMBERS BISHOP BENZIGER:

The Karnataka-Goa Province is full of gratitude to Mons. Aloysius Benziger OCD, the Bishop of Quilon. It was his keen desire to renew Carmelite Presence in Goa and that, during the 3rd centenary of the martyrdom of the Teresian proto-martyrs, Bls. Dionysius and Redemptus (1638-1938). He is said to have obtained due permission from the Patriarch of Goa during the National Eucharistic Congress held a year earlier (29-31 Dec. 1937) at Madras (now Chennai). In spite of his age, he went to Margao, Goa in the company of Fr. Mary Joseph (the first Goan Carmelite Friar) to promote the foundation.

Today (17th of August, 2017), the Malabar Province along with five Dioceses of Kerala (which originally comprised the first and oldest Diocese of Quilon), is marking this event in Trivandrum at our Carmel Hill Monastery Church, where his mortal remains have been interred. There is seminar in the morning, Solemn Eucharist in the afternoon followed by a programme and dance drama. In the absence of the Provincial, Rev. Fr Oswald Crasta (Provincial Councillor) is representing the Karnataka-Goa Province.

Bishop Benziger visited Rachol Seminary where Fr. Paul's father was physician. According to Fr. Mary Joseph OCD, Bishop Benziger blessed Fr. Paul who was around 5 years old. The following verses are composed by him in recognition of the Bishop's eagerness and interest in the first foundation of what became later the Karnataka-Goa Province.



LENTEN RECOLLECTION WITH FR. RAJESH MADTHA

Lent offers a perfect opportunity to step back from our everyday activities and assess our spiritual well-being. The Secular Carmelites in the Lower Mainland gathered on the Solemnity of the Annunciation of our Lord, Saturday, March 25, 2017 for a Lenten Recollection at St. Edmund's Parish in North Vancouver, B.C. Led by Fr. Rajesh Madtha, Chaplain of St. Paul's Hospital, Vancouver, they reflected on the theme, "Surely, Lord, You bless the Righteous; You surround them with Your favor as with a shield." (Psalm 5:12).

The day began with praying the Liturgy of the Hours and a Eucharistic Celebration with Fr. Jerald D'Souza, Provincial Delegate and Pastor of St. Edmund's Parish. His homily was a perfect start to the recollection, a reminder to follow Mary's fiat, in spite of her doubts, fears and even confusion. Members shared their breakfast offerings before re-grouping for Fr. Rajesh's talk.

The following summarizes Fr. Rajesh's words. "What are the means of receiving God's grace?" "Grace" from the Hebrew word "chen", meaning mercy, was given many definitions: favor, kindness, graciousness, piety, pleasant, well-being, delightful". When a person receives a gift and is not warranted of receiving it, best defines "grace". "How can we be gifted by the grace of God?" Holiness, is a gift offered to all. It is gifted to us by the Lord Jesus Christ when He takes us up, with Him and clothes us in Himself, making us like Him. The recollection was truly uplifting reminding us of God's call to holiness.






INAUGURATION OF MOUNT CARMEL SPIRITUALITY CENTRE PARKLAND COUNTY, ALBERTA


Fr. Provincial's message was simple and clear: Like the roots that keep up a tree, in Carmel, our relationship with God and others in faith keeps us stronger.



REPORT OF THE CARMELITES ANNUAL GATHERING AT LITTLE FLOWER MONASTERY – CARMEL HILL – CANADA REGION






CARMEN DE LOS SANTOS OCDS January 5, 1922 – January 10, 2017


